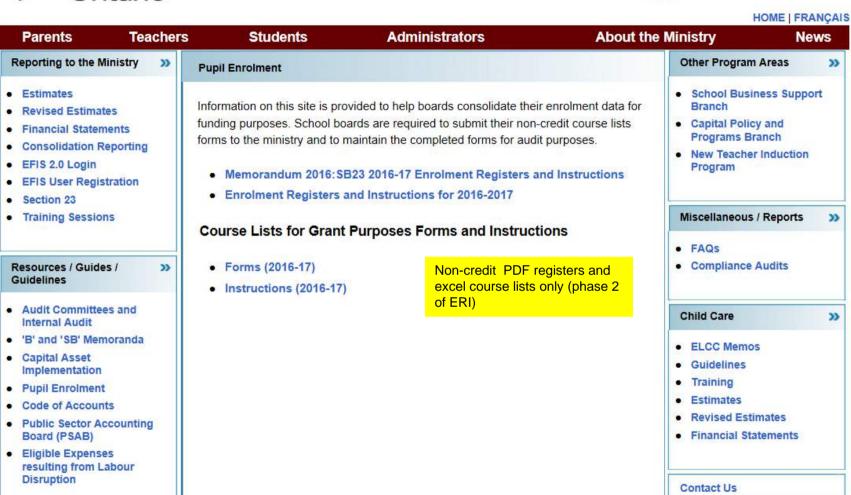

- By 2017-2018, all <u>funding data</u> submissions will be electronic.

Enrolment and Attendance on Con Ed Registers

Funding starts the first session the student is marked 'present' in the class. Indicate **attendance** at sessions by leaving the appropriate spaces on the register **blank** and **absence** by entering an "A". If a learner is admitted **after the course begins, a horizontal line is entered through all spaces up to the date on which the learner was admitted** (see learners 9 and 10 in the sample). If a **learner withdraws, a horizontal line is entered through the remaining spaces** (see learners 2,3 and 5 on first register example-Adult Credit).

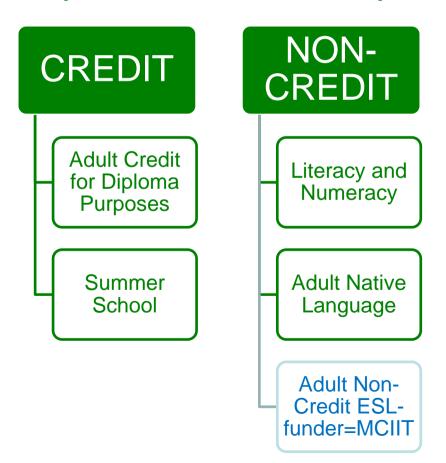
"C" day - Where an instructional session has been <u>cancelled</u> owing to **exceptional circumstances** (e.g., inclement weather has caused a breakdown in transportation arrangements or otherwise prevents learners from attending class), the session will be recognized for funding purposes if the instructor is still paid for the session and the session is not rescheduled. This session must be marked with a "C" in the register to indicate the cancellation, and the reason for the cancellation must be recorded.

 - For the period February 1, 2017, to June 30, 2017, the pupil is not enrolled as a full-time day school pupil on March 31, 2017.
